

## The Parish Church

St. Margaret's Church is the centre piece of the Parish. The oldest parts of the Church were first built 926 years ago and, since then, there have been a number of additions including the tower, the spire and the vestry. The building is a Grade 1 listed building with many features that are of great historic interest.

Over the years the building has been brought improved but it still lacks any toilets or even a mains water supply.

Nowadays, the Church building is much more than a place of worship and is used frequently for events embracing the whole community for all to enjoy as it has done over the centuries.

After 30 years of talking, at last, we are going to build the much needed new facilities for our Church. The scheme has been designed to provide:

NEW	toilet facilities for the able and
	disabled;
NEW	new vestry and meeting area for
	activities for young & old alike
NEW	A now convers 9 storage
INEVV	A new servery & storage
NEW	Level access throughout the
	building for the able & disabled.

## Now is the time ...

The key features of the extension is that it does not protrude into the body of the existing building thereby preserving the tranquillity and sanctity that makes the Church so special.

Great care has been taken in the design process to also ensure the footprint of the extension does not protrude into the churchyard area.

As a Grade 1 listed building, the Church has had to consult with and gain approval from many different bodies, including Historic England (formerly English Heritage), the Church Building Council, the Victorian Society and the Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings. Only after gaining these approvals have we been able to obtain planning permission from Mid Sussex District Council. The final step in the approvals process is to obtain consent from the Diocese of Chichester.

Now our thoughts are turning to financing and then to actually building the extension. We need to raise £290,000. So far, we have received £40,000 from our Parochial Church Council and, in addition, we are confident of recovering around £40,000 of VAT. This leaves a figure of around £200,000 to be raised.

We aim to raise the balance of this money from a variety of sources:

All of the monies raised will be transferred into a separate Building Fund account specifically and only for this project and related work.
