We believe that children and young people are gifts from God, who remind us that God’s power in this world is the power of vulnerability. They remind us that there is an unpredictable, sometimes energetic, sometimes still side to our Creator. Children and young people show us – if we have eyes to see it – what it looks like to love God with depth and spontaneity, with authenticity and wholeheartedness.

Children also remind us of the wonder of the Incarnation. God chose to send Jesus to us as the Word made flesh, beginning life as we all do, as a child.

God values children not only for what they will become in the future but for who they are today. Jesus even recommended to His disciples that to understand God’s Kingdom, they needed to observe, learn from, and imitate young children.

We invite you to consider what our society would be like if reaching the children, youth, and families of the community we are called to serve, became one of our major priorities as a church.

We suggest that you could use one or more of these prayers in your regular time with God. Through them we encourage you to strengthen and enhance the good work that has already begun at St Margaret’s, asking God for His guidance, and allowing the Holy Spirit to work through us all - in all that we say, all that we do and all that we are.

May God bless you in this vital ministry of prayer.

coming back together for a blessing




