Do you know how your village church, ST MARGARET'S CHURCH, WEST HOATHLY, is funded and how much must be raised annually?

St Margaret's Church here in West Hoathly lies at the centre of the village providing a physical focal point and a hub for weekly Christian worship. Its role is also to support Parishioners at important times of their life; life events – so a place to come for baptisms, weddings and funerals as well as the big Christian Festivals of Christmas, Easter, Harvest and Remembrance. 250 people attended the 2022 Christingle Service on Christmas Eve for example.

St Margaret's Church receives *no* outside funding except for a grant of £1200 from the Parish Council to help with the upkeep of the extensive Churchyard.

Have a guess at what it costs to run the church per year?

This figure is made up of 2 parts.

The Parish Share: which pays for our Vicar, their housing, pension, future training, advisors supporting the clergy, building and our village schools. In 2023 this figure for St Margaret's Church is £59,000.

Running and maintaining the Church Building: including heating, lighting, electricity, water, servicing, safety checks, maintaining the Churchyard and insurance premiums and all necessary licenses. In 2023 this figure for St Margaret's Church is forecasted to be in the region of at least £12,000.

So, the total cost for 2023 is expected to be around £71,000, which translates to approximately £5,900 per month or approximately £1,400 per week.

Currently the money comes from generous and loving donations by members of the St Margaret's congregation and other supporters of St Margaret's Church, the modest fees from the conducting of weddings and funerals, (baptisms are free) and an annual Churchyard grant from the Parish Council.

However...

The <u>projected income figure</u> for 2023 is <u>only £47,000</u> so we are facing a sizeable shortfall of £24,000 which is approximately £460 a week.

We need your help please to cover this shortfall, so that St. Margaret's Church can continue to benefit from the ministry of a full time Vicar, as well as continue to maintain the fabric of the Church and Churchyard both now and for our future generations.

With your help, and us all working together, we feel it should be possible to raise the necessary funds to reach the budget figures and secure a healthy and sustainable future for St Margaret's Church.
