#### **Letter to Parishioners**

# **New Beginnings**

I'm so delighted to be writing this, my first article for 'The Chronicle' in this beautiful place. And it is beautiful.

Jonathan and I are overwhelmed at how lucky we are to have found ourselves here, and we're very much looking forward to getting to know the area and its people more over the next months and years. We have arrived just in time to benefit from the last of the blackberries, but late enough to avoid intensive lawn mowing. We are so grateful for the very warm welcome that we have received.

One of the first festivals we will be celebrating will be the Harvest Festival, at our Sunday worship and with the children of West Hoathly Primary School.

Then, in November, we remember the people that have gone before us: the saints, the souls and those who have given their lives in war. Harvest and Remembrance are festivals in the calendar, but they are also very real in this place. We see at first hand the benefits of the land, and the gifts it brings, in food, but also in beauty. Our churches in Highbrook and West Hoathly have memorials to those who gave their lives in the first and second world wars. These memorials name people of these villages – who never returned to the beauty that we experience today. There is a real connection with our life as a community and it is important therefore that we appreciate both the harvest and the gifts of those who have gone before us.

These festivals won't be unfamiliar but will be new to me, in this place. As an 'incomer' I will be learning about how these communities gather and what is most important to them. I'm very much looking forward to standing alongside you as we celebrate and remember together. If you are also new to this community, please do come and join us.

The Bible comes to us through the hands of many generations, and parts of it stretch back to times thousands of years ago. The Israelites, searching for the promised land, were given a picture of this 'good' place:

A land with flowing streams, with springs and underground waters welling up in valleys and hills, a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive trees and honey, a land where you may eat bread without scarcity, where you will lack nothing, a land whose stones are iron and from whose hills you may mine copper. (Deuteronomy 8:7-9)

Not all land is the same as this, nor as fruitful, but this picture of goodness helps us to remember to be thankful for the earth and its beauty. We inherit it from those who have gone before us, and are custodians of it, making it ready for those who will follow us. Let us pray that we will look after it wisely and continue to appreciate its goodness.

#### Other Church Notices

1) Sunday Club at St. Margaret's Church: Every Sunday except for the first Sunday of the month. Young people from the age of 2 - 14 meet in the vestry to study God's word and learn about Jesus. We are very Blessed now to have between 4 - 6 families attending Church weekly which equates to 5 - 10 young people. Together we read the Bible, act out, discuss, craft & pray.

We then come back into Church to receive God's Blessing at the communion rail and give a brief account of what we have learnt to the congregation. Church worship is for everyone on a Sunday, and we take great care to include young people so that they feel important, cherished and loved. Please pray for the young people of our Parish.

- **2) Funding St. Margaret's Church.** it costs around £71,000 per year to run the Church which is £1400 per week. At the start of the year, we were facing a shortfall of £24,000. I am pleased to report that kind and generous households from the Church and wider community have pledged to cover a sizeable amount of this deficit which is wonderful news. However, there is still a good chunk to be found, so please consider giving regularly to St. Margaret's Church so that we can continue to provide all the services, ministries and vibrant Church life which exists at the moment, as well as maintaining this special grade 1 listed Building and Churchyard, at the heart of our community.
- **3) Flower Arranging at St. Margaret's Church:** In response to growing calls to stop using oasis foam for flower arranging here at Church we are trialling just using vases and chicken wire for support. Oasis is non-biodegradable and is deemed to be bad for the environment. So far we have had a positive response to taking this approach and the way the flowers have been arranged.

If you would like to get involved with arranging flowers in Church, please contact Derek Shurvell. We will be arranging flowers for **Harvest Festival on Saturday 30th September**, please check Church web site for timings.

- **4) Churchyard working parties:** These are held on the first Monday of each month from 2 4.00 p.m., the next ones are **2nd October & 6th November**. Jobs include weeding, raking, pruning, sweeping, tidying, cleaning & brushing. Together we keep the Churchyard tidy, do jobs that wouldn't normally get done and develop new ideas and projects. Currently 7 10 people attend, it would be lovely to double that number. please contact Derek Shurvell. Please note we will be removing the dead box hedge on the boundary with Church Hill. Once it has been dug out, we will pause and see what the view looks like before considering replacement or leaving it open.
- **5) Emmaus Youth Club:** for youngsters aged Year 6 Year 9 inclusive, (roughly 10 14-year-olds). We meet weekly during term times on Friday evening 6.30 p.m. 8.00 p.m. (Please note the change in time). Subs are £2.50 per session to cover refreshments; hall hire and other activity "ingredients". (Autumn program shown overleaf)

The Club meets in WH Village Hall, Sharpthorne Hall and outside depending on the activity. Evenings consist of games, activities and hanging out together. It is managed, overseen & safeguarded by St. Margaret's Church, all youngsters of the right age are most welcome.
